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

Overview on the programming process

- May 2019: Start of the project CAP-Strategic Plan for Austria (incl. Kick-off event)
- Aim?
 - One national CAP-Strategic Plan
 - submission to the Commission in the [second quarter 2021]
 - continuation with existing governance structures at national & regional level:
 - 1 MA + 1 PA for pillar 1 and 2
 - 9 federal provinces (Bundesländer)
 as equal partners in programming, implementation & financing
 - Involvement of public and environmental authorities, economic and social partners and bodies representing civil society during the whole process

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Preparation of the intervention logic for the CAP Strategic Plan: State of Play

1. SWOT analysis (Art. 103)

For each specific objective: overall description of the current situation and an analysis of strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats

2. Assessment of needs (Art. 96)

For each specific objective: identification of needs based on the SWOT analysis, prioritisation of needs and sound justification of choices made

3. Intervention strategy (Art. 97)

For each specific objective: targets and milestones, financial allocations, description of interventions

1. SWOT analysis (Art. 103)

For each specific objective: overall description of the current situation and an analysis of strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats



- Preparation of a draft SWOT analysis by experts from the Ministry, first draft in October 2019
- Public consultation: February March 2020
- Ex ante Evaluation: 4 WS in March 2020
- Revision of the SWOT on the basis of the feedback, final draft in July 2020
- Last **update** necessary before submission of the CSP (Green Deal, Covid-19 crisis, data)



2. Assessment of needs and prioritisation – state of play

2. Assessment of needs (Art. 96) For each specific objective: identification of needs based on the SWOT analysis, prioritisation of needs and sound justification of choices made October 2019 October 2019 October 2019

- Preparation of a draft needs analysis by experts from the Ministry
- Discussion within expert groups and ex ante evaluation team
- Revised draft of assessment of needs (August 2020): 45 needs identified
- Prioritisation of needs (still ongoing)
 - Grouping of needs: Aim: 4 groups (very high, high, medium, low relevance)
 - → no ranking of needs within these groups
 - 2 steps approach: assessment on the basis of common and transparent criteria
 - 1 step: common criteria "need for action" and "adequacy of the CAP plan"
 - 2 step: common criteria "political relevance"
- Broad stakeholder consultation still outstanding (after prioritisation of needs)

3. Intervention strategy (Art. 97)
For each specific objective: targets and milestones, financial allocations, description of interventions



- Ongoing process
- 14 expert groups for drafting of interventions set up in October 2019:
 - Area 1: Area and animal-related interventions
 - Area 2: Young farmers
 - Area 3: Rural development & sectoral interventions
 - Area 4: Horizontal implementation issues of the CAP-SP (IACS and non IACS)
- First drafts of 96 interventions in September 2020 (DP: 4, SI: 40, RD: 52 interventions)
- Stakeholder involvement on draft documents

Opportunities and Challenges

- + Strategic approach for the whole CAP in one single plan
- + Better coordination and cooperation between the two pillars (especially for the environmental & climate architecture, young farmers, investments)
- Process became more complex (more cooperation needed, more stakeholders involved, programming new task for pillar 1)
- Preparation of the CAP plan on the basis of a draft regulation & draft indicators
- Updated template for the CAP plan is needed
- Requirements for prioritisation of needs unclear for a long time
- One output indicator per intervention is limiting the flexibility for the design of interventions
- Annual planning of outputs/unit amounts/milestones challenging
- How to include the Green Deal recommendations (timing!)?
