Involvement

- → Standard procedure
 - × Annual report
 - × Programme modifications
- → Expert presentation of an RDP intervention
- → Monitoring committee on location
 - × Show some of the RDP interventions in practice
 - × Possibility to ask questions to farmers

Difficulties

- → Involvement of MC in macro vs. micro management
 - × Most members are mainly interested in the overall policy and content
 - × Eg. Detailed selection criteria for every intervention






CAP post-2020 in the Flanders region

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Planning of prepatory work and stakeholder involvement



• Description via indicators of the Flemish agri- and horticulture, the environment (linked to this) and the Flemish rural area



- Preparation SWOT (internal) + sectoral SWOT's (external)
- Two public surveys: SWOT > needs analysis



- Input: SWOT analysis + memoranda/other sources
- Feedback: stakeholder meeting
- Departmental analysis
- Policy objectives report
- Feedback: stakeholder meeting



- Strategy report
- Feedback advisory councils




- Brainstorm: stakeholder meeting
- Online public survey
- Working groups

Stakeholder involvement through the CAP post-2020 preparation

Other stakeholder events

- → Bilaterals
- → Ad hoc study days on specific themes
 - X Eg. How to make agriculture and nature go hand in hand

Difficulties

- → Formal (bound to offical positions) vs. informal (open, constructive discussion)
- → More stakeholders than possible want to be involved
- → Opposite interests
 - X How to come to a targeted strategy while consulting broad range of stakeholders?
- → Too high expectations
