Redistributive payments in Lithuania

➤ Started in 2014

➤ Budget 2014: 10% of DP envelope

> 2015 & onwards: 15% of DP envelope

>Threshold: 30 ha

Objectives and potential issues

Objectives

 reduce an income gap among farms of different sizes

 maintain the viability of smaller farms

Potential issues

 artificial conditions for splitting

 inefficient allocation of DP envelope

The results of redistribution



- ▶ 20% higher payments per ha for smaller farms than LT average and about 51.5% higher than for farms managing 500-1000 ha
- ➤ No artificial splitting of holdings has been identified

What next? \rightarrow 2023-2027

- LT SWOT analysis shows that:
 - the need for redistributive payments remains
 - off-farm income account for an important share of income in farms up to 20-30 ha
 - farms up to 50 ha face financial difficulties the most
- Considerations on the application of the following criteria for payments:
 - total output per 1 EUR of costs
 - farm net income per ha (or AWU)
 - number of full-time employees on the farm
 - average wages in the agricultural sector

Criteria simulation (one of the scenarios), EUR/ha



Payments as of 2023

Under this scenario, it is recommended that approx. 20 % of the DP envelope to be allocated to redistributive payments.
